

What is a Spiritual Growth Focus?

An intensive, extended, all-church emphasis involving every age group that focuses on a particular aspect of spiritual growth.

2. We grow by developing in five levels.

Your Christian education program should be built around these five levels of learning:

Knowledge:

People need to know the content of God's Word, and gain a working knowledge of the books, events, and people of the Bible. Ask: What do people already know? What do they need to know?

Offer:

New believer Bible studies and Surveys of the Old and New Testaments Five Core Books: Genesis, John, Romans, Ephesians, James

Perspective:

Christian doctrine provides a Christian perspective. The following 7 areas of doctrine should be taught:

- 1. Bible: inspiration, authority, canonicity, etc.
- 2. God: attributes, trinity, and works of creation and providence.
- 3. *Humanity:* creation, fall, and election.
- 4. *Christ*: His person (deity and humanity) and work.
- 5. *Salvation:* calling, regeneration, conversion (faith and repentance), justification, adoption, sanctification, assurance, etc.
- 6. *Church:* nature, purposes, leadership, ordinances, spiritual gifts.
- 7. *Future:* personal future, second coming, millennial views, resurrection and final judgment, future state.

Also teach God's perspective about work, money, pleasure, suffering, emotional health, etc.

Convictions:

This level includes developing godly values, commitments and motivations.

Skills:

Skills are related to doing: how to study the Bible, how to pray, how to handle temptation, how to get along with other people, how to be a godly husband and wife, how to raise children, etc.

Character:

Becoming like Christ in attitudes and actions. A good place to begin is to teach the fruit of the Spirit as described in Galatians 5:22-23.
